

stronger until it rises to a higher philosophical plain. Glenn St. Charles did that for his beloved sport of bowhunting. In this century our "legends" have been Ishi, Compton, Pope & Young, Bear and St. Charles.

His long history of involvement in the archery community as a Olympian, Competitor, Coach, and Journalist, makes Rick a valued asset to the board.


Co founder and publisher of Archery Focus Magazine Rick has written hundred's of articles for magazines around the world.




