How wonderful it is to report such fantastic progress regarding the home of the Archery Hall of Fame and Museum.

A location dubbed the "preview area" has recently been completed just inside the main front entrance of Bass Pro Shops in Springfield, Missouri, the permanent home of the Archry Hall of Fame & Museum. This "preview area" has the beautiful mural which is shown in the photo below . The large (approximately 8 ft. x 12 ft.) original canvas painting by Adam Wolken, depicts Ishi, Dr. Saxton Pope, Art Young, Howard Hill, and Fred Bear with a line of familiar 4-color targets in the background. This eye-catching mural further represents the Hall by having Olympic medals adorning the corners of the title banner which reads "Heroes and Legends".

Completing this sneak peak preview area is a large 3-dimensional AHOF logo and walnut exhibit cases which give a snap shot of what is to come when the actual AHOF & Museum is complete within the next year.




The founder of the National Bowhunter Education Foundation

- One of the World's Greatest Instinctive Archers
- His trick shooting exhibitions gave extensive exposure to the sport
- Educator of conservation, archeology, Native American lore and natural history

- Chaplain at West Virginia University
- Promoter of youth archery in the US and Canada
- · Appeared in many TV shows and films promoting archery
- Featured in Newsweek, Time and Reader's Digest promoting archery

Bowhunter, Influence on the Sport

- Tireless promoter of bowhunting
- First bowhunter to take a black rhino appeared in Ripley's Believe It or Not! - 1968
- First bowhunter to harvest African Big Five: lion, rhino, elephant, leopard, and cape buffalo using the conventional bow
- Author, Sagittarius, considered a bible by traditional bowhunters
- · Harvested virtually every species of North American Big Game

Influence on the Sport

- Served in the U. S. Air Force during World War 11 in the China/Burma/India theater of operations
- Life member of the NRA since 1940
- Pioneer of many cosmetic and functional improvements in laminated recurve bows
- Other design advancements included large risers, recurve wedges and decorative overlays
- Introduced the first 4-wheel and 2-wheel

compound bows
